Oliver Green (Mrs Page) for a superb 'Found Poem' with a wonderful structure. Super, hard work!

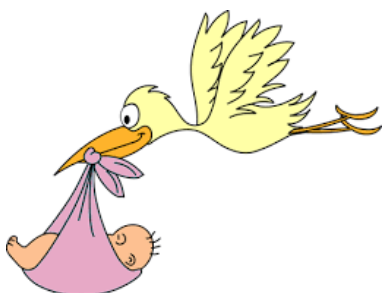
