BPS Does Sport Relief 19th – 23rd March

Bewdley Primary will be supporting Sport Relief again this year and a whole week will be dedicated to completing The Sport Relief Daily Mile Challenge. From Monday, 19th March to Friday, 23rd March, the children will be taking part in a one-mile challenge. Every day will have a different focus linked to how we're going to move for our mile. We might dance it on Monday, skip it on Tuesday and sing while walking it on Wednesday! All of the children will be able to take it at their own pace and some of our smaller children may complete their mile over the week rather than every day.



During that week, children are asked to come to school wearing sporty gear every day. It doesn't need to be PE kits, but footwear needs to be suitable for jogging, possibly even on the field if the weather picks up...

As we are asking parents to contribute to The Big BPS Book Fund at the moment, we won't be asking for donations to go towards the Sport Relief collection. However, from Monday 19th we will be selling Comic Relief wristbands for £1 each if you would like to purchase one.



This week the school have received a complaint from a local resident who has been verbally abused by a parent who was reversing at speed along the road.

Please can we remind you of the following;

Please do not block the footpaths when parking. Parents with pushchairs are having to walk in the road as paths are blocked.

Please drive at a sensible speed along the road, children can be unpredictable.

Please do not park on double yellow lines or the zig zag lines by the zebra crossing.

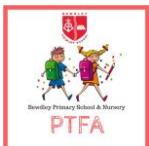
Please do not block resident's driveways.

Please do not do three point turns mounting the pavement whilst doing so, unless you are in a safe place.

The Safer Neighbourhood Team have been informed about our concerns regarding the parking in the area and will be patrolling the area.

On previous patrols they have received complaints about the parking in the layby. Whilst parking is allowed in the layby, it has been brought to our attention that parents are blocking the access to the layby which also blocks the pavement. Please note this is not allowed. All parking should be in the bays or alongside them in the afternoon, and in the same direction. Unfortunately, if this continues we will have to stop parking in the layby except in the spaces provided.

Whilst we all know that spaces are limited we must all ensure we park sensibly for the safety of everyone in and around the school.

Please also ensure that your child has a water bottle in school too.

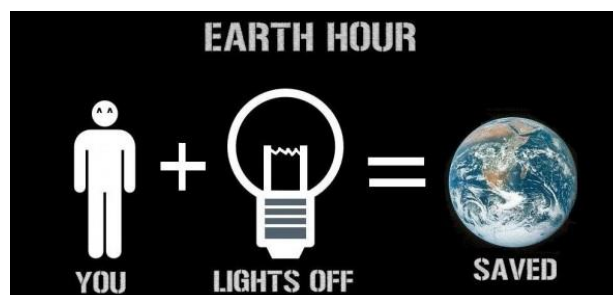
ECO NEWS
