


THE GREAT BEWDLEY BAKE OFF



Calling all Mary Berrys!

As part of our Spring Craft and Food fair, which is to be held on Saturday, 21st April, Bewdley Primary and Nursery PTFA will be launching the very first family baking competition – The Great Bewdley Bake Off!

We are inviting families to join together in the kitchen to create a show-stopping cake masterpiece. You can choose any recipe, shape, size or scale of cake but each entry must be decorated to link in with our Spring theme. We're hoping to see a complete array of creative cakes. You might decide to provide a traditional Spring theme with chicks, daffodils or lambs leaping from your cake or you might try something a little more distinctive in the hope of catching the judge's eye!

This is a family baking competition. We are not expecting children to bake and decorate these cakes entirely independently and we expect that adults will help to make sure that the cakes are made hygienically and to ensure that they are edible! As it's a family entry, it is absolutely okay to 'tidy up' cakes that might not be quite so competition-ready otherwise! We appreciate that some of our older pupils may like to enter on their own but please ensure that they are supervised accordingly.

Our Paul Hollywoods for the day will be announced on Monday, 16th April and they'll have the tricky decision of awarding prizes for the tastiest and most imaginative cakes presented on the day.

How to enter:

- Pick your most spectacular recipe. The one that will be unbeatable and is guaranteed to wow our judges.
- Bake, decorate and present your cake in the most astounding way possible. Add a label which describes your cake, so that the judges know what to expect – but don't include your name!
- Bring your spectacular, show-stopping cake to the Spring Craft and Food Fair on Saturday, 21st April. Please make sure that you have submitted your entry by 11.00am.
- When you've submitted your entry, a member of the PTFA will take your details and give you an entry number. We'll then be able to make sure that all entries are anonymous.

Rather than charging an entry fee for the competition, we'd love to be able to sell the cakes off after judging, either by the slice or as whole cakes.
