**Friday – Year 2**

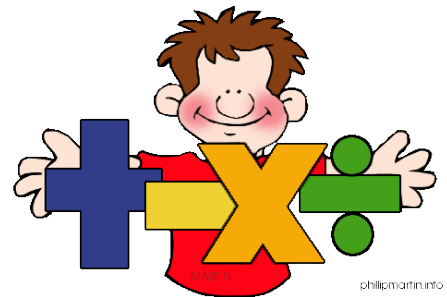
