All after school club letters have been sent home and booking forms should have been returned today. There are still spaces in most clubs so if your child would like to join a club please let the office know ASAP.

A reply slip will be sent home on Monday 14th January 2019 to let you know whether your child has a place and club costs will be added to your parent pay account at this point. Payment is required before your child starts the club. If payment is not received before the club starts your child will be unable to attend.

Forest school is part of the curriculum at Bewdley Primary School and therefore it is essential that your children have their kit every week. If you do forget, can you please drop the kit off **BEFORE 12:00**. Children who do not have the correct clothing, will use their PE kit and in cases where this isn't in school either, they will wear their school uniform. Hopefully, this will be easier to remember now that they are going every week regardless of the weather forecast, as conditions need to be extreme for us not to be spending at least part of the sessions outside.

Now that the weather has turned colder please ensure children have named warm waterproof clothing, and a hat and gloves – there is no such thing as the wrong weather for Forest School, just the wrong clothing!

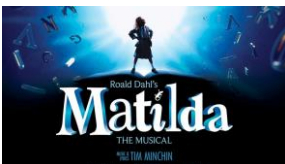


There are currently 2 reception places available at school. Please contact the school office if you know of anyone who may be interested.
