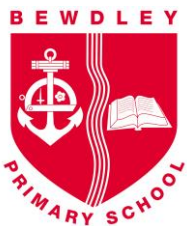

Sporting News

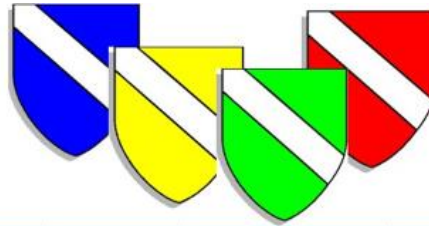
