James W (Blackman) for leading his team in our debate. He was able to share his views as well as challenging those of others.

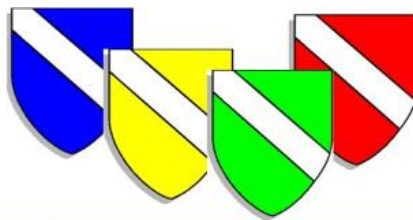
Rui G (Walliams) for aspiring to be the best that he can be in all areas of his work!
