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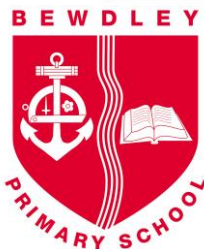

Daniel P (Dahl) for the amazing effort and interest he gave to his maps homework. He shared it all with such enthusiasm! Fantastic!

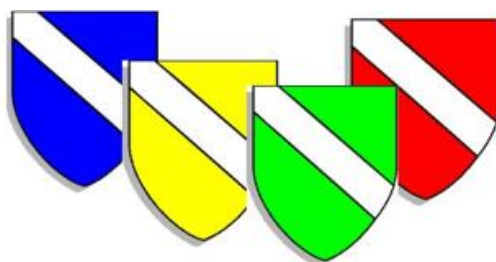
Rosie E (Rowling) for producing a fabulous piece of homework using her computing skills.
