### *Hand in Hand for Oscar*

As you will already know, children are welcome to come to school in non-uniform on Friday, 4<sup>th</sup> October as part of our American Music Celebration Day. When we initially planned this, it was not intended as a fundraising event but more to get into the swing of our 'American' school day.

However, over the past few days, you may have seen in the local news and on social media about the fundraising efforts of a family based in Worcester for a 5-year-old boy called Oscar. Oscar has T-Cell Acute Lymphoblastic Leukaemia and his recent stem cell transplant hasn't had the results hoped for, resulting in further treatment being required. The NHS are unable to provide this treatment and, as a result, a fund has been created to help raise the £500,000 needed to send Oscar to Singapore for therapy or to have a second stem cell transplant.

Sadly, these fundraising efforts have a very limited deadline which is why schools and businesses around the county are coming together to help bring hope to this family.
