Starting School in September

If your child is due to start school this September you need to apply for a school place by 15th January 2020. For more information and to apply, visit: www.worcestershire.gov.uk/schooladmissions



Please remember to book your child's school meal at least 48hrs in advance via Parent Pay even if your child has a free school meal.

If you book any meals on Parent Pay please remember you only have 2 hours to make the payment for that booking otherwise the booking will be removed by Parent Pay.



All after school clubs start next week commencing Monday 13th January.

Please ensure payment for the club has been made via Parent Pay before your child's first session to ensure they can participate.



Year 3 continue to swim every Tuesday. Please ensure your child brings their swim kit to school. Year 4 will not be going swimming this year.



At the start of new term please can we remind you of a few things in relation to the safety of everyone.

The school layby should only be used in the mornings as a drop off zone and vehicles should not be left unattended at any time. For the safety of your child and other pedestrians the layby must not be used in the afternoon.

When parking along the roads locally to school please park safely, legally and considerately. We are working very closely with our neighbours and West Mercia Police to ensure everyone is safe. Do not park on zig zags, on double yellow lines, do not mount pavements or park on the grass verges and please turn your engines off while waiting.

The large tarmacked area immediately outside the red fence at the front of school is not to be used as a parking space or a drop off point.



For the safety of pedestrians please do not allow your child to ride their scooter, balance bikes or scooters once inside the red fence.



Dogs are not allowed on the school grounds, please do not leave your dog unattended and tied to the red fence at the front of school. Children may still approach you dog unaware of how they might react.


