Dear Parents/Carers

I hope that you have been enjoying the sunshine this week and had the opportunity to make the most of it!

We are about to send you a few documents today with regard to the opening of the school from 1<sup>st</sup> June for specific year groups. We have now completed a full risk assessment which has been approved of by the governing body and sent to county for approval. Assuming that this approval is given and the government agrees its 5 tests have been achieved, we will begin opening from next Monday.

We have decided to stagger the introduction of all the year groups back to school in order to check that our plans are going to be effective in terms of minimising the risks at the start and end of the school day.

Therefore:

This means that by Wednesday we will have Nursery, Reception, Year 1 and 6 back in school along with key worker and vulnerable children in Yrs 2 – 5.

It is very important that we know what your plans are as we have allocated children to 'bubbles' based on parents/carers having informed us that their child is likely to return. If you have changed your mind, you must let us know. Please do this via your classteacher's direct email or through Tapestry.

You will be notified of your child's bubble in a separate email/Tapestry message today.

You will be sent a grid explaining what time your child needs to arrive and be collected each day and which entrance/exit they need to use. Please be aware that although the school will be open from 8:30 am – 3:30pm, your child's day may be different to this in terms of timings – it is vital to our organisation that these drop off and collection times are adhered to. We are not able to offer any wrap around care at this point due to the need to keep children in their 'bubbles'.

We are also sending some additional guidance. If you have questions which are not answered by the information sent during the day, please email the classteacher or send a message via Tapestry.
