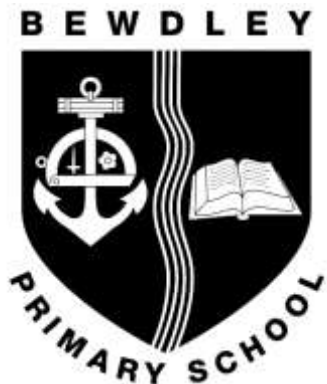


PE and Sport Premium 2019 – 2020
