Please note that during the term before your child is due to move to the Elmer's 3-4 year old nursery, Mrs Talbot our nursery administrator will be in contact with you to ask you for the sessions that you would ideally like. Unfortunately, we are unable to guarantee that your child will have the same sessions as in the 2-3 year old nursery as it depends on availability, although we always try.

Children will stay in the Hungry Caterpillar's 2-3 year old nursery until they are old enough to move up to Elmer's 3-4 year old Nursery in the September after they are 3. Please note that Elmer's Nursery will be for children in their pre-school year only. Therefore, children will stay in Hungry Caterpillar's Nursery for up to 5 terms, depending on their date of birth. **Please note that when completing the form below, children in Hungry Caterpillar's nursery, will only be able to use RASCALS' wrap around care from the term after they are three.**

Please be aware that attendance at either our Hungry Caterpillar's nursery or our Elmer's nursery does not guarantee a school place, or give any advantage in the application process. You will still need to apply for a school place through the Local Authority, in the usual way.

The Hungry Caterpillars Nursery: Please tick you preferred sessions for our 2-3 year old nursery:

The core hours for The Hungry Caterpillars nursery are Monday – Friday 9am-3pm, term time only.

2-3 year olds:

There are 5 core sessions available via 2 year old funding, or paid for at £15.60 per core session. No wrap-around care is available. However, early morning sessions are available from 8:30-9:00am at a cost of £2.50 per session.

3 year olds (the term after they turn 3 only):

There are 5 core sessions available via 3 year old funding, and 10 core sessions available if you are eligible for 30 hours funding. You can pay for additional core sessions at £13.50 per session, there are also early morning sessions available from 8:30-9:00am at a cost of £2.25 per session and Wrap Around care is available from 7:30 – 8:30, 3:00 – 4:20 and 4:20 - 5:30 at a cost of £4.50 per session.

The core nursery funded hours are as follows:

Monday – Friday Mornings: 9.00am – 12.00 midday

Monday - Friday Afternoons: 12.00 midday – 3.00pm

Please note that we do not offer a single session or day place. The minimum we offer is two half days, on different days, as in our experience, children find it extremely hard to settle in nursery if they attend for anything less than this number of sessions.

Definitions

*'Looked after' means all those currently in the care of a Local Authority or accommodated by a Local Authority under the terms of the Children Act 1989 and children who were previously in the care of or accommodated by a Local Authority but immediately after being looked after, became subject to an adoption, a child arrangements order or special guardianship order.

**The sibling connection, as well as brother and sister will include half-siblings, adopted children, step-siblings or a child of the parent/carers address. Children who are brought together as a family by a same sex civil partnership and who are living at the same address, are also considered to be siblings.
