Dear Parent/carer,

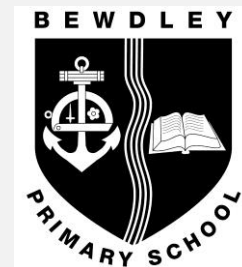

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3. Children who live in catchment (please note that priority will be given to children that are in receipt of 2 year old funding).

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4. Children who live outside the catchment and will have siblings** at the school when they start Reception (please note that priority will be given to children that are in receipt of 2 year old funding).

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5. Children of staff at Bewdley Primary School, where that member of staff has been employed for two or more years, and/or is recruited to fill a post for which there is a demonstrable skill shortage

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6. Children without siblings in the school when they start Reception, who live outside the catchment, (please note that priority will be given to children that are in receipt of 2 year old funding).

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7. Children who live outside the catchment and do not have siblings** in the school. (Please note that priority will be given to those who live within the shortest distance in a straight line from Bewdley Primary School).

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Definitions

*‘Looked after’ means all those currently in the care of a Local Authority or accommodated by a Local Authority under the terms of the Children Act 1989 and children who were previously in the care of or accommodated by a Local Authority but immediately after being looked after, became subject to an adoption, a child arrangements order or special guardianship order.

**The sibling connection, as well as brother and sister will include half-siblings, adopted children, step-siblings or a child of the parent/carers address. Children who are brought together as a family by a same sex civil partnership and who are living at the same address, are also considered to be siblings.
