

### Road Closure Notification

We have been notified by Worcestershire Highways and Transport that Bewdley Road North (The road from the island by the Bewdley School to Burlish Crossing) will be closed for 3 weeks from Monday 16 May 2022. The closure will take place between 9.30 – 3.30pm daily. With the week commencing 23<sup>rd</sup> May also including temporary lights on the island by Blackstone.

Please allow extra time when travelling to school.



To celebrate The Queen's Platinum Jubilee, we are inviting all parents and carers to join us in a whole-school outdoor concert on Friday, 27th May. This will be our first whole-school event, with parents, for quite some time and we are so excited to be able to come together to recognise this milestone together.

The concert is due to start at 1:45pm and parents/carers will be allowed onto the field from 1:15pm. Due to the number of visitors we are expecting, we will be opening additional entrances for the event. Further information will be given closer to the time. We anticipate that the concert will have finished by 3pm and children can be collected from their classrooms as usual.

Each child will be allocated 2 tickets for the event. If you would like additional tickets, a waiting list will be available through the school office when spare tickets are returned. Physical tickets will be sent home during the week beginning 16th May.

To ensure that the concert is a success, we have hired a professional company to provide a high-quality sound-system for the day. To help cover the cost of this, we are asking parents and carers to make a suggested donation of £2.00 per ticket via ParentPay.

Parents and carers need to bring their own seats for the event—we recommend camping-style chairs in case the field is a little on the muddy side. Please do not bring picnic blankets as you won't be able to see anything from the floor! The show will go on, regardless of the unpredictable British weather, so please come prepared for both heatwaves and snowstorms!

Teachers have sent letters home to let you know what your child needs to wear for their part of the concert and we thank you in advance for your support with this.
