

School Uniform Policy

School Uniform Policy

We work hard to achieve high standards at Bewdley Primary School. These standards relate not only to work but also to attendance, behaviour and dress code. School uniform gives the children a sense of belonging and identifies them in the community. All pupils are expected to wear school uniform and the list below has been carefully planned to keep the costs reasonable.

Uniform

- Grey trousers, grey shorts, grey pinafore dress or grey skirt
- Red and white gingham dress can be worn in summer
- School sweatshirt, cardigan or red jumper
- White shirt / white polo shirt
- Grey socks, plain grey, red or white socks or tights
- Black school shoes (sensible sandals can be worn in summer) or plain all black trainers.

P.E

- Black Shorts
- White T-shirt with school logo
- Spare socks
- Trainers
- Plain black joggers and a black or red sweatshirt. This can either be a school branded version or a non-branded plain one.
- A drawstring PE bag can be ordered with black shorts and white PE shirt

Forest School

- Long sleeved plain red or black t-shirt
- Plain black joggers or leggings
- Appropriate coat and wellies when required (should be in school for younger children)
- Waterproof trousers and tops are provided in school

Swimming (for years 3 and 4 children only)

- Girls (no bikinis or tankinis)
- Boys trunks or shorts (no longer than knee length)

Please note that should your child fail to attend school with the correct uniform, we will reserve the right to ask them to get changed into any spare clean uniform we have within school.

School Fleeces/Hoodies

School fleeces and hoodies are available to order online and are a smart addition to our school uniform. Our uniform suppliers are Marks and Spencer or Earth Uniform.

Coats

Please ensure your child wears a coat appropriate for the day's weather conditions.

Summer Caps

Summer caps are available to buy online.

Wellingtons for nursery / reception children

Children in nursery / reception classes are asked to keep a pair of wellingtons in school for outdoor activities.

Nursery Children

Although we do not have a specific uniform for Nursery children, we do have the option of a blue branded t-shirt, jumper or cardigan.

Otherwise, nursery children should be dressed in practical, suitable clothing for all activities. They should have wellies to keep in school. Please note that sometimes the children may get messy, so it is advised to only send your child into nursery in clothes you feel appropriate.

Jewellery

Children are not allowed to wear jewellery in school or nursery due to the risk of injury to themselves or others. Children who have had their ears pierced are only allowed to wear stud earrings in school and nursery and are asked to remove these during PE lessons. Our advice is to have your child's ears pierced at the start of the summer holidays, so that earrings can be removed for PE activities.

Make Up/False Nails

Children are not permitted to wear make up, nail varnish or false eyelashes in school. Likewise, nail extensions or acrylic nails are not allowed due to health and safety when undertaking PE.

Mobile Phones

Children are not encouraged to bring mobile phones into school. However, in exceptional circumstances, when a mobile may be needed, parents are asked to put the request in writing and the phone will be kept in the school office during the school day. Please refer to the Mobile Phone Policy.

Book Bags

Children will be given a book bag with the Bewdley Primary School logo on free of charge when they start in Reception. These protect home reading books and are simple to fasten for younger children. Replacement book bags are available to purchase online.

Labelling Uniform

To avoid the expensive and distressing loss of your children's clothing at school you need to make sure that all items of uniform are named.
