Maths

This week we will be learning to count forwards and backwards. We will count in ones, is that each number is 1 less than the number before. The number 4 is 1 less than the number 5.

Phonics – Digraphs

The children will be recapping all the digraphs which we have learnt so far. These are below with the phonics characters. We will be linking these digraphs to sounds within words and objects, spelling simple words containing these digraphs and forming letters correctly. At school we will continue to meet these characters, which are shown below through songs and stories.

We will also continue writing simple sentences focusing on the simple punctuation capital letters, finger spaces (between words) and full stops during our phonics lessons.
