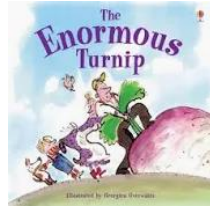

Shape of the week: triangle

These are the sentences the children will learn about circles

This is a triangle

A circle has 3 sides

A circle has 3 corners

Activities:

This week we will consolidate our understanding of sequencing, positional language and more and fewer.

We will consolidate our understanding of sequencing by sequencing our nursery day and the familiar rhyme Incy Wincy Spider

We will move objects around and explain where we have placed them using the language **on, under, in, out, in front of** and **behind** and look at different groups of objects to decide which has more and which has fewer.

Phonics

This week in phonics the children will begin to learn all about initial sounds (the sound that can be heard at the beginning of a word)

The children will play games of I Spy using the environment and books and teachers will model the intimal sound of words. In small groups we will then look at sorting objects by the initial sound that we can hear.

During our child-initiated opportunities, the children will continue to revisit and refine their tripod grip and make marks and letters to show their name.
