



1. Create a Spy Profile

Design a character profile for a fictional WWII spy. Include:

- Name and code name
- Nationality and background
- Secret mission(s)
- Disguise and gadgets used
- A drawing or sketch of them in action

2. Soundtrack of a Spy

Research music from the 1940s and create a **spy-themed playlist** that might have been used to set the mood for a spy film or mission. Choose at least 3 tracks and explain:

- Why they suit the theme.
- What emotions or suspense they create.

3. Code Breaker Challenge

Research and create a simple **cipher code** (e.g., Caesar cipher).

- Write a secret message using your code.
- Ask a classmate or family member to decode it.
- Explain how and why codes were important in WWII.

4. Invisible Ink Investigation

Try making **invisible ink** at home using lemon juice or milk.

- Write a hidden message.
- Reveal it using a heat source (**with adult supervision!**)
- Write a short explanation of the science behind it.

6. Spy Map

Create a **map of Europe** during WWII and plot key locations linked to spy missions (e.g., SOE bases, escape routes, coded radio signals).

- Add facts or labels about what happened at each place.

7. Spy Interview

Write and perform (or record) a short **interview with a WWII spy** (real or fictional, like Nancy Wake or a made-up character).

- Prepare at least 5 questions and answers.
