Dear Parents and Carers,

Back in November, we sent out a consultation to parents and carers regarding school uniform, with the aim of making our pupils look smart and feel proud to wear the school colours, whilst keeping the uniform comfortable and practical. We were really clear that our intention wasn't, and still isn't, to add any unnecessary, additional cost on to parents.

We are so pleased that the views of over 70% of our community were shared, giving us a really broad and balanced view of our school's thoughts. The results of the survey were then shared with governors who discussed the responses and suggestions from parents.

The main outcomes following the consultation with parents and then with the governing body are as follows:

- From September, hoodies will only be part of the school uniform on PE days and Forest School days.
- From September, all hoodies must be plain red, rather than red or black. They can have the school logo on but large brand names, logos or slogans are not permitted.
- Plain black trainers will remain as part of the everyday school uniform, as long as they are plain black.
- Polo shirts and PE t-shirts will continue to be white.

We ask parents and carers to support the school with these changes and will also be talking to the children as part of our uniform reminders. If your child's sensory needs mean that they may not be able to follow the school's revised policy, please contact Mrs Bennett, our SENDCo, to discuss any potential exemptions and how we can support them with this.

We have recently had an influx of children across the school not wearing the correct uniform, particularly on PE days. If you are unsure about an item, please ask your child's class teacher. We appreciate that children may be growing out of items, particularly in Year 6, but with three months of the summer term still to go, we ask that you adhere to the school uniform policy as closely as possible.

Similarly, we are having more and more children coming to school wearing make-up. They will be asked to remove it using make-up wipes once in school but we'd really appreciate it if you could make sure they're not wearing it before coming to school. Similarly, acrylic or false nails are not to be worn at any time.
