Dear Parents and Carers,

On Thursday 16th July, Bewdley Primary will be holding its annual Sports Day for children in Reception to Year Six! Reception and Key Stage One (Years 1 and 2) will hold their events in the morning and Key Stage Two (Years 3-6) will be in the afternoon.



10:00 Reception and Key Stage One will begin their events

12:00 (Approx.) Whole school picnic on the field with parents and other Sports Day visitors

12:45 Whole school picnic ends and all children to return to their classrooms to register

1:00 Key Stage Two will begin their events

End of school day at usual time for all children

What does my child need to wear?

Children need to wear their usual school PE kit of a white t-shirt and black shorts or joggers. Hopefully the weather will be kind but, if not, they'll need their red or black sweatshirt or hoodie. Children will be competing in house teams within their year group but they don't need to wear coloured t-shirts.

What does my child need to bring to eat?

They need to have a packed lunch which can easily be eaten outside.

This can be brought in as usual by your child or visitors may wish to bring their picnic with them, if planning to share lunch together. Please remember to have a water bottle in school too, for the children to use while competing.

What if they have hot dinners or free school meals?

No hot dinners will be available on this day.

School picnic lunches can be ordered in advance for children who usually have hot dinners or universal/free school meals. This will be their lunch on Thursday 16th, even if Sports Day is rained off.

What about if it rains or the field's a boggy mess?

We'll try to make sure the event goes ahead unless it would be unsafe to do so. We'll give parents as much notice as possible if we do have to cancel the event.

Who can come to Sports Day and picnic?

Any visitors are welcome to join us for all or sections of the day. They should enter the school premises via the usual school gate where staff members will be on duty to open and close it as required.

Are we allowed to bring things to sit on?

This is probably recommended, particularly for picnicking! Due to the high volume of people expected, adults will need to remain outside on the field during their visit, except for when using toilet facilities through the main office.
